A community-based not-for-profit organisation and a finalist this year under the Professional Services category in the BEX Awards, TTEC provides work-related training as a Registered Training Organisation, a Job Network service (Tweed Recruitment), a Labour Hire service that provides temporary staff for many local industries, the Youth Enterprise Service on Queen Street Murwillumbah and Volunteering Tweed on Nullum Street Murwillumbah.

Sharon Styman has also joined as a member of the Board of TTEC and has a history of previous community involvement, having worked in the Family Centre.
