

Are you ready to street dance?

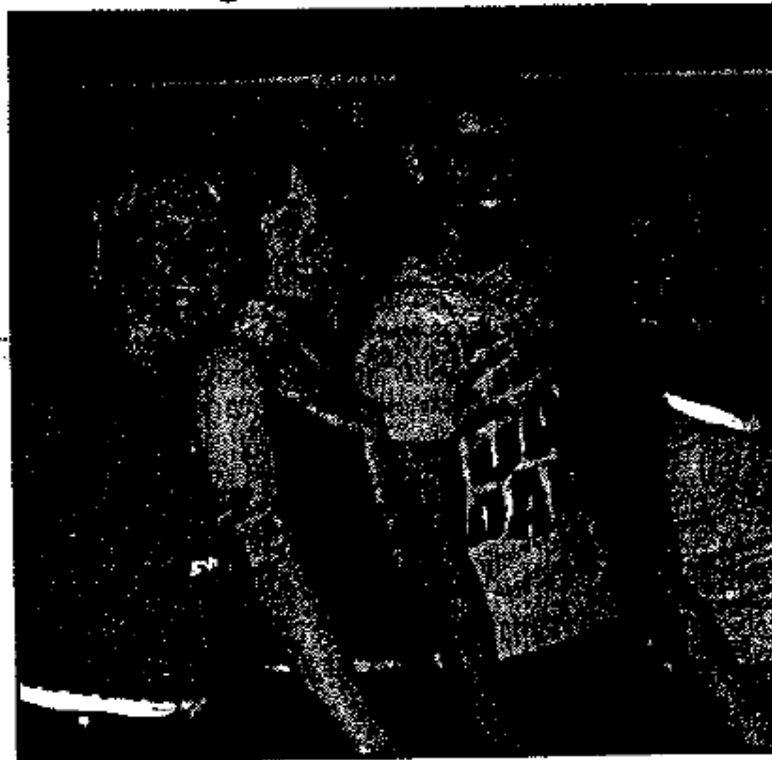
THREE local teenagers have emerged from eight months of intensive training as hip hop/street dancers to help other Tweed youngsters learn the techniques.

Hannah Buck, 15 of Burringbar, Adam Henson, 15 of Kingscliff and Monique Lampard, 17 of Tweed Heads are planning free hip workshops, with the first beginning on this Saturday, 14 June at the Tweed Heads PCYC.

Saturday's workshop is open to all ages and stages and runs from 10am to 1pm.

Following this, both Adam and Monique will run a five-week series of free *Strictly Street Dance* workshops at the Tweed

Heads PCYC. These will begin on Thursday, 19 June with a 'Kids Hip Hop' session for ages 8-12 years from 5.45pm to 6.30pm and a 'Beginners Hip Hop' sessions for ages 12 and over on from 6.30pm to 7.15pm.

Hannah will also hold a free workshop in Murwillumbah at a later date to be confirmed.

A consent form must be signed by parents for participants under 18 years and participants will need to wear comfortable shoes, clothing and bring water to drink.
